With Deacon Anthony Mammoliti

Sicily and Calabria. Fires have spread rapidly and have caused considerable amount of damage to homes and property. The people have been praying for relief from this heat and for rain to fall to end the drought. Something in stark contrast to what has been the weather of late in NY.

Through all of this many of the people have asked "where is God in all of this?" Today's Gospel reminds us that we must have confidence that God is always with us, even when it seems we are surrounded by raging storms and unsettled waters. Confidence is the word we need in our lives today. It is a word which comes from the Latin "to believe with." We can not have confidence when we are alone, we can not have confidence without an Other; that Other is God. One can find confidence even in the most chaotic of times; the most perilous of times. And that's the point of today's readings. One can find confidence, even in the worst of storms, even in the most chaotic of times. You can go through the worst that life can throw at you if only you keep up your contact with God. No prayer? No confidence. Stop coming to Mass? No confidence. Not sharing in the life of the Church, in the Body of Christ? No confidence. Soon you'll take your eyes off of Jesus, and just like Peter, you will sink. Soon you'll only be able to hear the screaming wind, the awful noise, and the deafening roar of the storms and winds in our world that shake the very foundations of our life. And without the voice of God and the eyes of Jesus to hold you steady, we, like Peter, will either be blown away or drown. Is your life getting out of control? Is your faith slipping away from you? Are you experiencing more and more powerlessness in the chaos that surrounds you? Then pray for God to be with you and give you the confidence you need to navigate life's troubled waters. "Where is God in all of this?" The real question is not where is God in all of this?; rather where are we with God in all of this?

«Chi non prende la propria croce e non mi segue, non è degno di me. Chi accoglie voi accoglie me» (Mt 10,37-42):

" In quel tempo, Gesù disse ai suoi apostoli: «Chi ama padre o madre più di me non è degno di me; chi ama figlio o figlia più di me non è degno di me; chi non prende la propria croce e non mi segue, non è degno di me. Chi avrà tenuto per sé la propria vita, la perderà, e chi avrà perduto la propria vita per causa mia, la troverà. Chi accoglie voi accoglie me, e chi accoglie me accoglie colui che mi ha mandato. Chi accoglie un profeta perché è un profeta, avrà la ricompensa del profeta, e chi accoglie un giusto perché è un giusto, avrà la ricompensa del giusto. Chi avrà dato da bere anche un solo bicchiere d'acqua fresca a uno di questi piccoli perché è un discepolo, in verità io vi dico: non perderà la sua ricompensa».

Alle richieste fondamentali della carità cristiana. I legami familiari non possono asservire e soffocare la Oggi ascoltando dalle labbra di Gesù: «Chi ama padre o madre più di me non è degno di me...» (Mt 10,37) restiamo assai sconcertati. Però scavando un po' più in fondo, ci rendiamo conto della lezione che il Signore vuole trasmetterci: per il cristiano, l'unico assoluto è Dio e il suo Regno. Ognuno deve scoprire la loro vocazione — forse questo è il compito più delicato di tutti— e seguirla fedelmente. Se un cristiano o cristiana hanno vocazione al matrimonio, devono rendersi conto che svolgere la loro vocazione è amare la loro famiglia come Cristo ama la Chiesa. La risposta a la vita cristiana come una vocazione a cui tutti noi siamo stati chiamati, ha una esigenza particolare per tutti noi, anteporre legami familiari a quelli della fede, se con questo non manchiamo vocazione alla cui siamo chiamati, sposi, figli, religiosi, sacerdoti, laici. Dietro la parola "amore" può nascondersi un desiderio possessivo dell'altro, che toglie la libertà di sviluppare la loro vita umana e cristiana; o la paura a lasciare il nido familiare e affrontare le esigenze della vita e la chiamata di Gesù a seguirlo.

E 'questa distorsione dell' amore che Gesù ci chiama a trasformare in un amore gratuito e generoso, perché, come dice San Agostino, «Cristo è venuto a trasformare l'amore." El amore cristiano, es un servizio agli altri, donazione totale senza risparmiare niente per noi. Il vero amore, si dona totalmente ad esempio di Cristo. "Chi sono mia madre e i miei fratelli? Sono tutti color che fanno la volonta di Dio". L'amore e l'accettazione, saranno sempre il cuore della vita cristiana, verso tutti e soprattutto verso i membri della nostra famiglia, perché di solito sono i più vicini, e anche costituiscono il "prossimo" che Gesù ci chiede di amare.

Nella accoglienza agli altri si trova sempre la accoglienza a Cristo: "Chi riceve voi, accoglie me" (Mt 11,40). Quindi dobbiamo vedere Cristo in coloro che serviamo, e anche riconoscere Cristo servo in quelli che ci servono. Domiamoci oggi. Veramente accogliamo Gesù, nel povero che bussava la nostra porta, per chiedere aiuto? E di più. A casa siamo capaci de accogliere a tutti, figli, nonni, mama e papa, fratelli e sorelle con lo stesso amore con cui Cristo Gesù ci accoglie, e ci ama? Ci preoccupiamo per gli altri, o viviamo di un modo indifferente?.

HOMILÍA DOMINGO XI TIEMPO ORDINARIO

Mateo 14,22-33

Pongamos nuestra confianza en Dios y no en las fuerzas que nos amenazan.

En la primera lectura, Elías, siendo un hombre de oración, no se dejó confundir por el huracán, ni por el fuego ni por el terremoto. Supo descubrir más bien a Dios en la tenue brisa. La oración es la fuerza de Dios y la debilidad del hombre. Cuando oramos con fe, Dios se nos revela, se nos manifiesta y nos libera del miedo, de la angustia, la oración nos da fuerzas, como a Elías, para seguir caminando en la fe. En el Evangelio de hoy, los discípulos, no supieron reconocer a Jesús que caminaba sobre el lago. ¿Por qué les costaba tanto entender si Jesús había hecho el milagro del pan y los peces ese mismo día? La falta de oración, de fe y de confianza en Dios, llena nuestra vida de miedos, de angustias y desesperación. La oración es para el cristiano, lo que es el agua para el pez, si no oramos se muere el alma.

Pedro demostró una gran fe al salir de la barca para caminar sobre el agua hacia Jesús. Pero pronto comenzó a hundirse. ¿Qué ocurrió? Al sentir de repente el azote del viento, quitó los ojos de Jesús y se fijó en su propia incapacidad ante las olas. **Tanto Jesús como las olas son realidad. Pero Jesús es la realidad suprema del hombre, no hay nada por encima de Él, él es fundamento de la vida, de la fe y la esperanza. El nos dice "Sin mí, ustedes nada pueden hacer".** Pedro olvidó la realidad suprema, que es Jesús y se encerró en una realidad secundaria es decir en la tempestad. Frente a las pruebas de la vida, debemos mirar más allá de ello, a Jesús que va en nuestra barca que está allí, donde nos parece que no está Dios. Pedro miró a la criatura y se olvidó del creador. Cuando ponemos nuestra mirada y confianza en las criaturas, todo es inseguro.

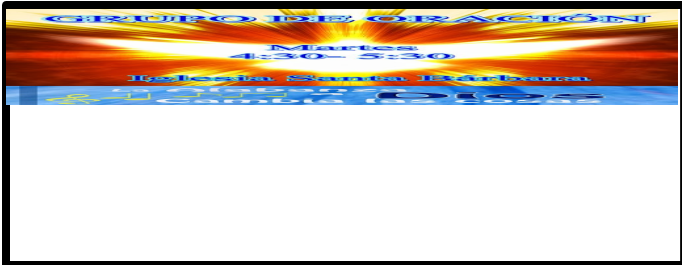
¿Cómo podemos evitar ese gran error? 1. Orar: quiere decir entrar en intimidad con Dios. Para saber cómo actuar en cada dificultad, o necesidad, es necesario ser orantes como Elías y Jesucristo, quien estaba largo tiempo solo con su Padre. Solo quien ora conoce a Dios. Orar es conocer íntimamente a Dios. Quien ora ama, y tiene la seguridad en Dios que es amor.

2. Luchar con los recursos que Dios nos da. La lucha del cristiano, en este mundo dice el apóstol San Pedro, no es contra los poderes visibles, sino contra las fuerzas invisibles del mal, que son obra de Satanás, que como león rugiente, ronda por el mundo, buscando a quien devorar. Jesús permitió que los discípulos lucharan toda la noche. Cuando todo parece oscuro, siempre debemos luchar como un soldado en el campo de batalla.
