COMMUNITY CHAT With Deacon Anthony Mammoliti

Knowing what to do, feeling lost and perhaps looked down upon by others due to the situation you find yourself in. Today's Gospel recounts a very similar story. Jesus is approached by a woman; not just an ordinary woman, but a Canaanite woman. This woman has reached a point in her life in which she is desperate for help; desperate to save the life of her child. She endures the indignity of begging; begging to a man who was socially her superior. Jesus at first ignores her plea. Her persistence and her belief that Jesus is the answer to her prayers moves Jesus to answer her request.

In the divine scheme of things, the more we lose the more we win. The more we give, the more we receive. The more we go down, the higher we ascend. Ask anyone who has ever successfully completed a recovery program, they will tell you that you find power over whatever demons beset you when you surrender to your Higher Power. God came among us with healing power and He is looking for our faith. The Canaanite woman came to God in faith and in search of healing and found it.

Your task and mine as well is to live a life-story just like hers. Can you? Can I? Yes, we can, because Jesus lived it first and then gave us the power and the capacity to live lives like that. The question is not: Can we? The real question is: Will we?

Per la Comunità Italiana

Dal vangelo secondo Matteo 15,21-28)

In quel tempo, partito di là, Gesù si ritirò verso la zona di Tiro e di Sidòne. Ed ecco una donna Cananèa, che veniva da quella regione, si mise a gridare: «Pietà di me, Signore, figlio di Davide! Mia figlia è molto tormentata da un demonio». Ma egli non le rivolse neppure una parola.

Allora i suoi discepoli gli si avvicinarono e lo implorarono: «Esaudiscila, perché ci viene dietro gridando!». Egli rispose: «Non sono stato mandato se non alle pecore perdute della casa d'Israele». Ma quella si avvicinò e si prostrò dinanzi a lui, dicendo: «Signore, aiutami!». Ed egli rispose: «Non è bene prendere il pane dei figli e gettarlo ai cagnolini». «È vero, Signore - disse la donna -, eppure i cagnolini mangiano le briciole che cadono dalla tavola dei loro padroni».

Allora Gesù le replicò: «Donna, grande è la tua fede! Avvenga per te come desideri». E da quell'istante sua figlia fu guarita. . **Parola del Signore**

Per sfuggire ai suoi avversari che gli rimproverano di trasgredire le pratiche giudaiche relative all'impurità, Gesù si ritira verso la regione pagana di Tiro e Sidone (nel sud del Libano). Ma anche qui ritrova la questione dei confini tra il puro e l'impuro: la supplica di una cananea gli mette di fronte il problema della salvezza dei pagani. Stranamente, Gesù, in un primo momento tace, come se condividesse il particolarismo arrogante dei giudei nei confronti di quei "cani di pagani". Si direbbe che esiti, e quando finalmente si decide a rispondere alla donna, lo fa con durezza, senza mezzi termini. Il motivo è che c'è in gioco il disegno di Dio, che vuole radunare dapprima le pecore perdute d'Israele, e soltanto in seguito, a partire da questo popolo rinnovato, accogliere i pagani, secondo la misura della loro fede, che farà appartenere anch'essi alla grande famiglia di Abramo, il padre dei credenti.

Come si conclude allora l'episodio della donna cananea? Essa non pensa di avere un qualche diritto al pane dell'amicizia divina riservato in primo luogo ai giudei. Chiede soltanto le briciole, ma con tanta fede e con tanta umiltà che riceverà alla fine integralmente la salvezza sperata. Nell'accoglienza riservata da Gesù a questa straniera, i cristiani del primo secolo hanno visto un modello profetico di come loro stessi dovevano comportarsi nei confronti dei credenti venuti dal paganesimo. Bisognava uscire dai limiti di una religione di élite, per proporre una salvezza universale legata non alla razza, ma alla fede. Chiediamoci anche noi, oggi, se siamo capaci di vivere un vangelo senza frontiere, lasciandoci alle spalle la tranquilla sicurezza delle nostre abitudini e dei nostri pregiudizi. Con qualche briciola sottratta alla nostra tavola, molti dei cosiddetti "pagani", con la loro fede umilmente ostinata, potrebbero restituirci il sapore di un pane universale, offerto e ricevuto gratuitamente. **BUONA DOMENICA.**

HOMILIA DOMINGO 20 DE AGOSTO 2017

(Mateo 15,21-28) "Ten compasión de mí"

Un hombre ateo y un católico, se encontraron y el católico le pregunto al ateo: "que diferencia encuentra usted que es ateo, y yo que soy cristiano católico. El ateo sabiamente dijo: "lo primero es que yo no creo en Dios ni en nada, pero lo único es que yo hago muchas cosas buenas y tengo todo, buena salud y un linda familia, pero mi problema es que no se para donde voy ni tengo a quien darle gracias, Respondió el católico: "Aunque no veo a Dios, si creo en él, y le rezo siempre, y le doy gracias. Luego pregunto al católico: "y tú qué diferencia ves entre tú y yo? cuando pienso en la muerte, me siento tranquilo porque él me prometió y me esposa, tengo a quien pedirle la salud, y cada vez que me levanto, o llego a mi espera en el cielo, igualmente, cuando estoy enfermo o uno de mis hijos o mi casa, o cuando algo me falta, yo tengo a quien pedirle y él me lo da, y tengo siempre a quien darle gracias".

Son muchos los creyentes que han perdido casi totalmente la costumbre de orar. Recuerdan, quizás, oraciones que hacían de niños, pero hoy no aciertan a dirigirse a Dios. Desearían, tal vez, volver a comunicarse con él, pero no saben por dónde empezar. Hemos reducido la comunicación, solo con el celular, de lo cual queda muy poco. Ya muchos cristianos no rezan, no oran, no hace silencio, no acuden a Dios. Seamos realistas. ¿Cómo puede orar un hombre o mujer sometido al ritmo ordinario de la vida moderna? ¿Qué pasos puede dar? Yo pienso que debemos comenzar por recuperar de forma sencilla la oración de la mañana y de la noche. Hay muchas maneras de levantarse, pero lo normal es iniciar el día de forma casi automática.

No rezamos. La persona se va sacudiendo de encima el sueño de la noche, despertar no es algo pasajero, sino un acontecimiento importante: se nos está mientras se da prisa para no llegar tarde a sus ocupaciones. Sin embargo, el regalando un nuevo día para vivir. Motivo para decirle al Señor, "Gracias. Señor porque amanecí vivo". Algunos tienen posibilidades de pararse unos minutos y comenzar el día de manera más consciente. Si lo hacemos, enseguida nos vendrán a la mente las preocupaciones de la tarde y los problemas que nos aguardan. Puede ser el momento de recogernos ante Dios para darle gracias por el nuevo día y pedir su fuerza y su luz. El nos acompañará a lo largo del día. El rezo de una oración conocida—padrenuestro o avemaría— nos pueden servir de ayuda. Pero tenemos que rezar, orarle al Señor. Hay personas que no tienen tiempo, ni condiciones para empezar el día orando con calma. Hay que darse prisa, los hijos pequeños no nos dejan en paz, nuestra cabeza está ocupada por mil cosas. » Basta. Lo importante es reavivar cada día como creyente que puede elevar su corazón a Dios y pensar con gozo: «Dios me ama y me ayuda, por medio de la oración.

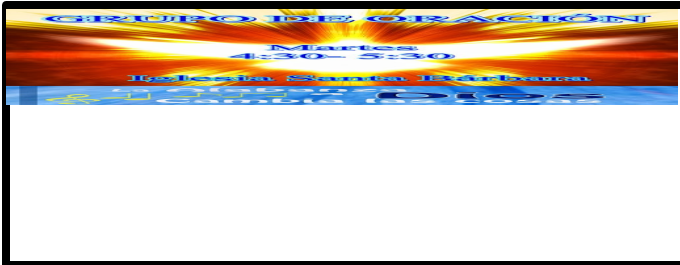
La oración de la noche es diferente. Por lo general, la persona cuenta con más tiempo y posibilidades. Nos disponemos ya a descansar de las tensiones y trabajos del día. Entregarse al sueño puede convertirse para el creyente en un acto de abandono confiado en manos de Dios. Pedimos perdón y nos confiamos a su misericordia. El signo de la cruz o el rezo de una oración sencilla nos pueden ayudar. Estos gestos tan sencillos como la mujer del evangelio de hoy,—a más de uno le pueden hacer sonreír— inscritos en el ritmo diario de nuestra vida, hecha de días y de noches, nos permite vivir de modo más consciente nuestro ser de «hijos de Dios» hablando con él «como un amigo con su amigo». Esta oración acompañado por un Dios Amigo, no es una obligación. Es una necesidad gozosa para quien camina por la vida
