movie is the signature song "Let it Go." You know the song; it's been played so many times. How appropriate, for in today's Gospel we are called to "let it go."

Anger is a very strong emotion. It has the ability to consume us. It holds us back, it prevents us from forgiving. It destroys our lives. I have never met anyone who has not been offended by many different people. We hold on to that anger. It becomes a grudge and in some cases it even fosters hatred. Do you know what happens? Our anger, our grudge, our hatred and our refusal to forgive holds us back.

A family member once said "well I'm going to take this anger and grudge to the grave." Trust me it sounds prettier in English; it loses a little in the translation from Italian. We cannot be good Christians and allow ourselves to be bogged down in anger and a refusal to forgive. The servant in today's Gospel was forgiven a great debt, yet he was consumed with anger over a small debt owed to him.

The Gospel of Christ demands forgiveness. The Gospel of Christ demands forgiveness even when we think we are justified in our anger. We must mean what we pray when we say "forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." By putting aside our anger and grudges we embrace love; we embrace God's love for all of us.

Is there someone who has offended you? Is there a situation from years ago that has had a negative impact on your life? Or maybe it is a recent offense that is gnawing at you. The gospel today, like that Disney song urges us to just simply....."Let it go."

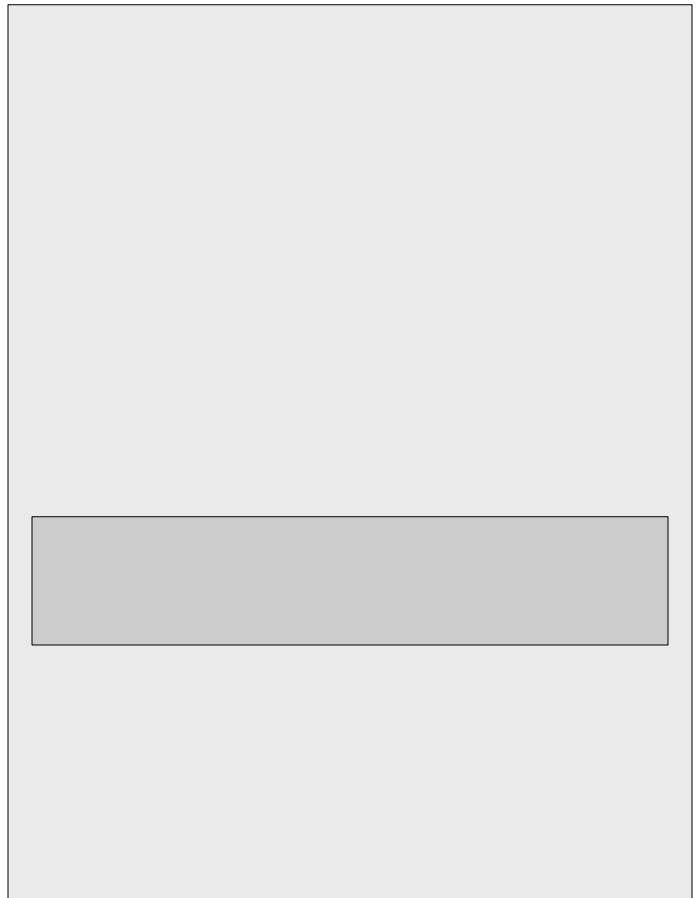
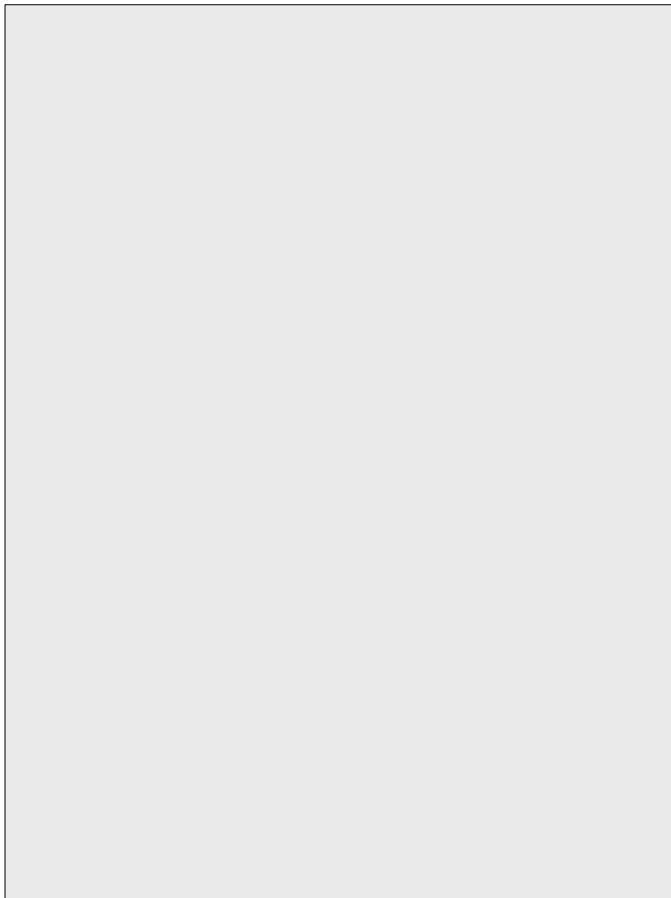
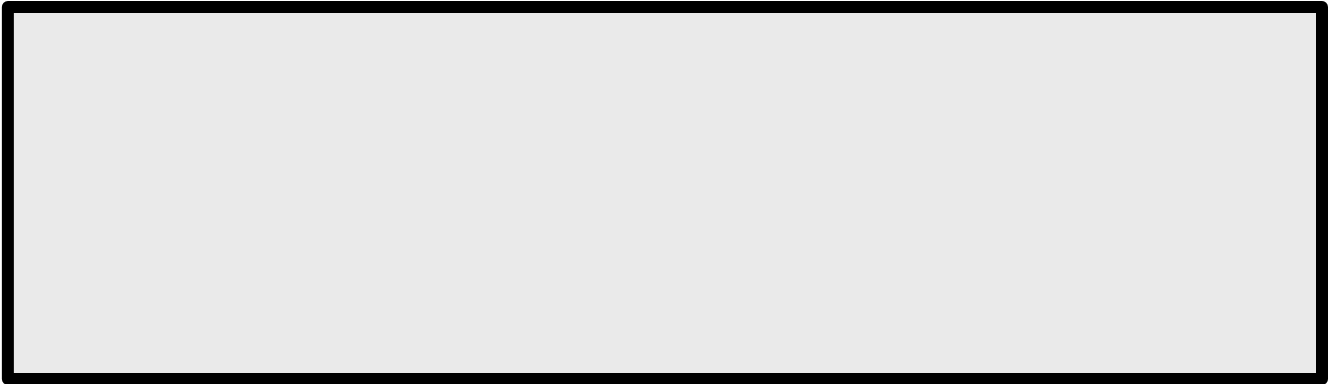

Matthew 18:21-35

Peter approached Jesus and asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times. That is why the kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. When he began the accounting, a debtor was brought before him who owed him a huge amount. Since he had no way of paying it back, his master ordered him to be sold, along with his wife, his children, and all his property, in payment of the debt. At that, the servant fell down, did him homage and said, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back in full.' Moved with compassion the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan. When the servant had left, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a much smaller amount. He seized him and started to choke him, demanding, 'Pay back what you owe.' falling to his knees, his fellow servant begged him, 'Be patient with me, and I will pay you back.' But he refused. Instead, he had the fellow servant put in prison until he paid back the debt. Now when his fellow servants saw what happened, they were deeply disturbed, and went to their master and reported the whole affair. His master summoned him and said to him, 'You wicked servant! I forgave you your entire debt because you begged me to. Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?' Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

fratello contro di me, quante volte devo perdonare? Fino a sette volte? "Questa questione apparentemente semplice tocca fibre molto profonde nella vita degli individui e delle comunità. Per i colombiani, questo problema di perdono è alto nell'agenda nazionale, come il dialogo in Havana progredisce. Il libro dell'Ecclesiastico ci dice: "Le cose abominevoli sono rancore e rabbia; ma il peccatore si aggrappa a loro ". Perché sono abominevoli? Perché la rabbia e la rabbia sono come un acido che distrugge chi li accoglie e genera dinamiche perverse. Le persone avvelenate con amarezza e rabbia diventato ossessionato dalla vendetta e distruzione e sociale e familiare lasciano emotive di lesioni personali, le implicazioni, e. Spesso sentire alcune idee sbagliate circa le idee perdono, che appaiono nelle conversazioni: Il perdono non è quello di banalizzare la gravità degli eventi, come se non fosse accaduto molto grave. Questo è un errore e devi chiamare le cose con il loro nome. La verità deve essere la roccia fissa su cui si proietta un futuro diverso per chi è stato offeso.

Per il cristiano la parola perdono acquisisce una ricchezza speciale, perché va oltre. Il Salmo 102 ci mette nella dimensione divina del perdono: "Il Signore perdona i tuoi peccati e guarisce le tue malattie. Salva la tua vita dalla tomba e ti riempie con amore e tenerezza ". Per il cristiano, il perdono come un incontro con l'altro, è impregnato di tenerezza; Non è la spaventosa esperienza di dover affrontare un tribunale minaccioso, ma essere di fronte ad un padre che aspetta di tornare a casa come ha fatto con il figlio prodigo (Luca 15); né rinchiuderci in una camera di terrore a vivere con il nostro peggior incubi, l'odio e il risentimento .. Nella parola di Dio, il processo di conversione non è un'iniziativa che ha la sua ispirazione iniziale in noi, ma è un'iniziativa di Dio che ci invita a tornare a Lui per iniziare una vita diversa: "perdona offesa al tuo prossimo, e così quando si chiede il perdono perdonerà i vostri peccati. Se un uomo ha un dispiacere contro un altro, può forse chiedere al Signore la salute? " Il rapporto tra me e gli altri - Dio forma un insieme indivisibile, poiché la riconciliazione con Dio è inseparabile dalla riconciliazione con i fratelli. Chiedere perdono non è tornare nel passato, aprire ferite e risvegliare i fantasmi inquietanti; la fede ci permette di riesaminare il nostro passato per diventare un contributo di una nuova vita alla luce della Pasqua del Signore. In questa parabola si sottolinea l'importanza del fair play: l'impiegato chiede al re di perdonarlo e di dargli una seconda possibilità; e quando ha lasciato questo pubblico, aveva un comportamento opposto con il suo partner che gli doveva soldi. Pulire il gioco nella riconciliazione, esclude i pregiudizi e la ritorsione, o la vendetta. Ad un certo punto dobbiamo mettere fine all'incubo di avere un nemico e guardare al futuro. Per perdonare il fratello è iniziare a guardarlo in un modo diverso, proprio come Dio ci guarda. Con amore e misericordia. Non dimentichiamo che ciò che rende più un uomo più simile a Dio è il perdono. SE IL DIO VI VEDE COME UN FIGLIO, OSSERVA ALTRO COME VETTORE.

HOMILIA DOMINGO XXIV (Septiembre 17)

El perdón, una difícil lección que debemos aprender (Mateo 18, 21-35)

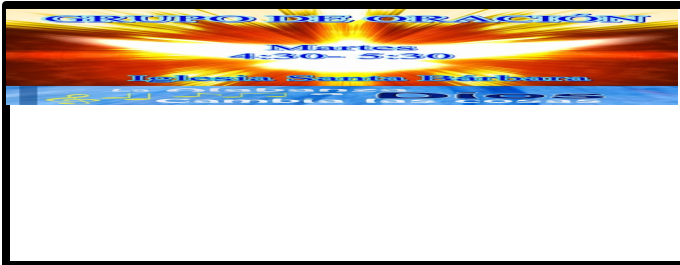
El relato evangélico de este domingo comienza con una pregunta que el apóstol Pedro hace al Señor: **“Si mi hermano me ofende, ¿cuántas veces tengo que perdonarlo? ¿Hasta siete veces?”** Esta pregunta, sencilla en apariencia, toca fibras muy hondas en la vida de los individuos y de las comunidades. Para los colombianos, esta problemática del perdón ocupa un lugar prioritario en la agenda nacional a medida que se avanza en los diálogos de La Habana. El libro del Eclesiástico nos dice: **“Cosas abominables son el rencor y la cólera; sin embargo, el pecador se aferra a ellos”**. ¿Por qué son abominables? Porque el rencor y la cólera son como un ácido que destruye a quienes los acogen y generan dinámicas perversas. Las personas intoxicadas con el rencor y la cólera se obsesionan con la venganza y destrucción y dejan heridas emocionales, implicaciones, familiares, sociales y personales. Es frecuente escuchar algunas ideas equivocadas sobre el perdón, que aparecen en las conversaciones: El perdón no consiste en banalizar la gravedad de los acontecimientos, como si en realidad no hubiera sucedido algo muy serio. Esto es un error y hay que llamar a las cosas por su nombre. La verdad tiene que ser la roca firme sobre la cual se proyecte un futuro diferente para quien ha sido ofendido.

Para el cristiano la palabra perdón adquiere una especial riqueza, pues va más allá. El Salmo 102 nos ubica en la dimensión divina del perdón: **“El Señor perdona tus pecados y cura tus enfermedades. Él rescata tu vida del sepulcro y te colma de amor y de ternura”**. Para el cristiano, el perdón como encuentro con el otro, está impregnado de ternura; no es la aterradora experiencia de tener que enfrentar un tribunal amenazador, sino estar frente a un padre que espera que regresemos a casa como lo hizo con el hijo prodigo (Lucas 15); ni es encerrarnos en una cámara del terror para convivir con nuestras peores pesadillas, de odio y resentimiento.. En la palabra de Dios, el proceso de conversión no es una iniciativa que tenga su inspiración inicial en nosotros, sino que es una iniciativa de Dios, que nos invita a volver a Él para iniciar una vida diferente: **“Perdona la ofensa a tu prójimo, y así, cuando pidas perdón se te perdonarán tus pecados. Si un hombre le guarda rencor a otro, ¿le pueda acaso pedir la salud al Señor?”**. La relación yo-los-otros-Dios forma un todo indivisible, pues la reconciliación con Dios es inseparable de la reconciliación con los hermanos. Pedir perdón no es regresar al pasado, para abrir heridas y despertar inquietantes fantasmas; la fe nos permite reeditar nuestro pasado para convertirlo en insumo de una vida nueva a la luz de la Pascua del Señor. En esta parábola, se destaca la importancia del juego limpio: el empleado le pidió al rey que lo perdonara y le diera una segunda oportunidad; y cuando salió de esta audiencia, tuvo un comportamiento contrario con su compañero que le debía dinero.
