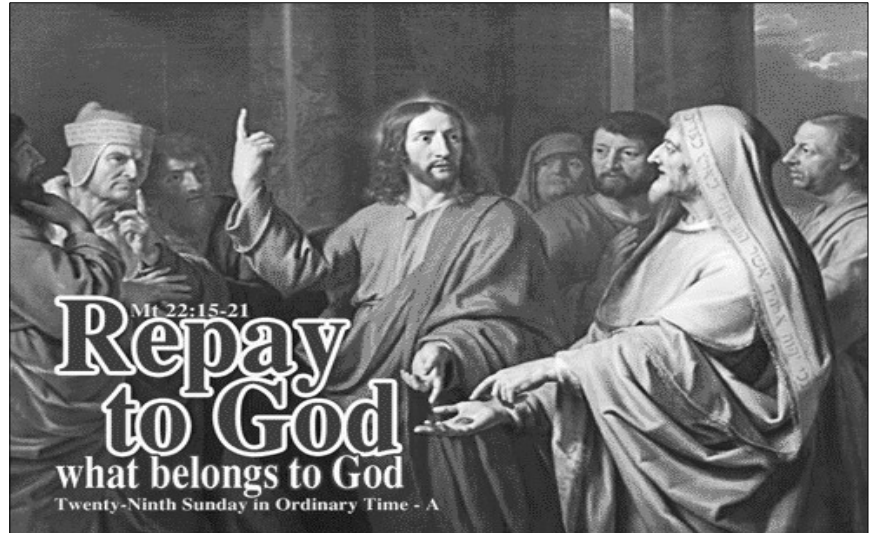

prepare for filing our income taxes. It is something we all detest but unfortunately is a necessity. We have to give to our government what is owed to our government, even when we think it's too much.

Today's Gospel is a familiar one. Jesus encounters both the Pharisees and the Herodians. The Pharisees, the religious fundamentalists of the day, hated the Roman tax. The Herodians, those Jews who supported the Roman puppet King Herod, supported the tax. Both groups, the Pharisees and the Herodians, hated each other. But here we find them joined together in a combined effort to trap Jesus, to discredit Him, and thus do away with Him, each trying to trap Jesus for their own reasons.

They ask Jesus if it is right to pay taxes. Jesus' reply is to "render to Caesar what is Caesar's but render to God what is God's." Furthermore, we need to realize that Jesus' response was directed at the precise issue of whether or not the Roman taxes should be paid. Jesus said nothing about the autonomy of Caesar in his secular role. Nor was Jesus making any statement at all about separating religion from society. So these questions remain: What is Caesar's, and what is God's? Is there anything at all that is not God's – is there anything at all in human activity that does not stand under God's judgment?

What mattered to Jesus was that they give to God what is owed to God; practicing justice and honesty, showing mercy and compassion, forgiving those who have hurt you, accepting all people in love and inclusion, and to simply live the gospel. This is the message that applies to all of us today. We should not get caught in the trap of worldly possessions. We should not be blinded to the injustices in the world. We should not turn our backs to those in need; the homeless and marginalized. We faithfully follow Jesus and we rightly obey the laws of our nation.

What is Caesar's and what is God's? The question is just as important to us now as it was when it was put to Jesus. What is your answer?

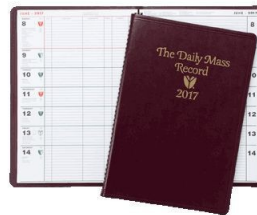

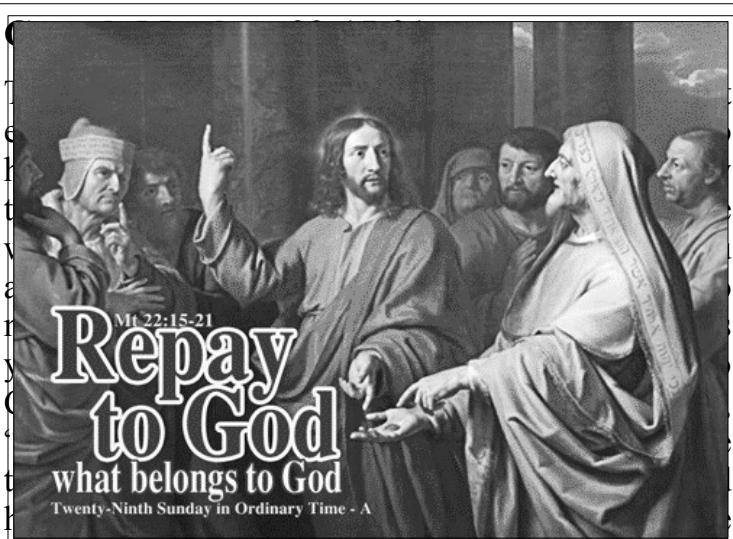

# Per la Comunità Italiana

"A CESARE QUEL CHE È DI CESARE E DIO QUEL CHE È DI DIO?" (Matteo,22-15-29)  
DOMENICA 22 OTTOBRE 2017.

Gesù osserva che la sottomissione al potere terreno è doverosa, in quanto dall'autorità terrena dipende anche la nostra vita e la nostra convivenza. Riflettiamo un istante: non è contraddittorio, e per certi versi anche lesivo, che si deprezzi la moneta con cui ogni giorno spendiamo per vivere? Se dall'Impero derivano tasse e tributi, sempre dall'Impero ci provengono anche le monete che adoperiamo per sopravvivere ogni giorno, non importa se con un conio biasimevole. Rispettare l'autorità è quindi necessario anche per la nostra stessa convivenza, poiché comunque essa è garante dell'amministrazione del paese in cui viviamo. D'altra parte l'obbedienza alle istituzioni è sinonimo di ottemperanza al potere, che a sua volta ha in ogni caso origine divina. Ogni autorità deriva da Dio e va rispettata. Pagare le tasse equivale a contribuire al progresso e allo sviluppo del paese, fare la propria parte perché si creino condizioni da una goccia: una sola goccia non fa l'oceano, ma se non ci fosse quella, l'oceano ne resterebbe senza. Anche per questo è importante che l'onere stesso dei tributi non gravi su pochi cittadini, costretti tante volte a colmare le lacune di altri inadempienti, ma che tutti, ciascuno in relazione alle proprie sostanze e alle proprie possibilità, spronino se stessi alla responsabilità nell'adempiere tale obbligo.

E se tutti fossimo puntuali nel rispetto delle leggi e dei doveri certamente e strutture di ausilio per un retto equilibrio sociale. Restare sottomessi all'autorità comporta creare l'oceano a partire mentre si instaurerebbe un regime di pacifica convivenza a vantaggio di tutti. In Gesù vi è quindi il sentimento di riconoscere nel regime politico umano la presenza ispiratrice di Dio e pertanto concede al governante ciò che gli è dovuto. Proprio di Gesù è insomma essere ben disposto verso le autorità legittime, ma anche chiedere ad esse una giusta amministrazione e un adeguato perseguimento della giustizia, dell'equità e del bene comune. Politica e religione certamente viaggiano ciascuno sul suo campo di pertinenza, ma nulla oppone che esse possano conciliarsi e vivere in stretta simbiosi, perché del resto l'obbedienza al re può configurarsi come servizio disinteressato a Dio. Scrive infatti Pietro: "State sottomessi ad ogni istituzione umana per amore del Signore: sia al re come sovrano, sia ai governatori come ai suoi inviati per punire i malfattori e premiare i buoni. Onorate tutti, amate i vostri fratelli, temete Dio, onorate il re." (1Pt 2, 14. 16 - 17). Le condizioni che si pongono sono quelle della reciproca intesa fra i doveri del cittadino verso le Istituzioni e gli obblighi di queste nei suoi confronti e pertanto sulla promozione della buona e retta convivenza. # Para La Comunidad Hispana

HOMILÍA DOMINGO 22 DE OCTUBRE 2017

"DEN A DIOS LO QUE ES DE DIOS Y AL CESAR LO QUE ES DEL CESAR"

(Mateo. 27,15-21)

La máxima que Jesús lanza quienes le preguntan, si es lícito pagar el impuesto al cesar o emperador romano, "de a Dios, lo que es de Dios y al cesar lo que de cesar", va mas allá de invitar a obrar justamente, pagando los impuestos, como expresión moral de los deberes de un autentico ciudadano. Entre ellos no robar, siendo justo. Jesús con esta enseñanza, nos quiere recordar hoy que no puede existir "divorcio entre la fe y la vida diaria de los cristianos, y esto nos lo recuerda la Iglesia en su magisterio, diciéndonos, que debe ser considerado como uno de los más graves errores de nuestra época.... "El cristiano que falta a sus obligaciones temporales, falta a sus deberes con el prójimo, falta, sobre todo, a sus obligaciones con Dios y pone en peligro su eterna salvación" (GS 43).

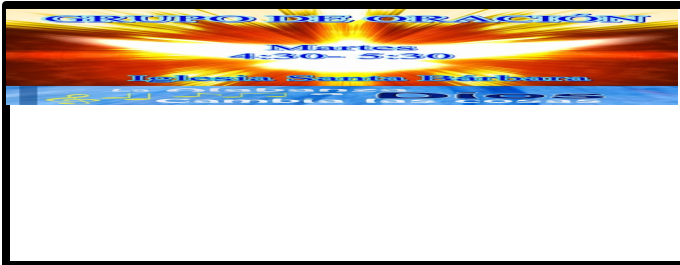
Entre las obligaciones temporales del cristiano se destaca el pago de los impuestos, que para un cristiano es un deber de justicia y un deber de conciencia. El Estado, gracias a los impuestos, garantiza el orden, el comercio y los demás servicios sociales; por lo mismo tiene derecho a una contrapartida, precisamente para seguir prestando tales servicios. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica tacha como moralmente ilícito el fraude fiscal, considerándolo un robo (n. 2409.. Esto supone naturalmente que el Estado sea justo y equitativo al imponer los impuestos. Bueno sería que nuestros políticos de turno, leyeran esta enseñanza y la practicasen, siendo honestos y no corruptos. La colaboración de los cristianos no se agota, ciertamente, con el pago de los impuestos. Debe extenderse también a la promoción de valores comunes, como la familia, la defensa de la vida, la paz, la solidaridad con los pobres. Eso es "Dar al César lo que es del César; a Dios, lo que es de Dios". Por lo tanto, no hay que dar al César lo que es de Dios. Al César, en consecuencia, no es lícito dar, sacrificar, la vida de las personas. Según la enseñanza reiterada de Jesús, los pobres son de Dios, los pequeños son sus predilectos: a ellos les pertenece el reino de Dios. Entonces "nadie ha de abusar de ellos. No se ha de sacrificar la vida, la dignidad o la felicidad de las personas a ningún poder. Y, sin duda, ningún poder sacrifica hoy más vidas y causa más sufrimiento, hambre y destrucción que esa dictadura de una economía sin rostro y sin un objetivo verdaderamente humano que, según el papa Francisco, han logrado imponer los poderosos de la Tierra. No podemos permanecer pasivos e indiferentes acallando la voz de nuestra conciencia en la práctica religiosa".

También a la vivencia del domingo semanal podemos aplicar la máxima "dar al César lo que es del César y a Dios lo que es de Dios". Es bueno que "demostramos al César", a lo humano, a los valores familiares y lúdicos, al descanso corporal y psíquico lo que se les debe. Pero, a la vez, no podemos descuidar lo que le "debemos a Dios", porque para los cristianos el domingo es el día de la creación, el día de Cristo Resucitado, el día del Espíritu Santo que en Pentecostés bajó sobre la comunidad eclesial llenándola de vida. Es el día de la reunión comunitaria para celebrar la Eucaristía. Sobre todo en este día lo humano y lo espiritual han de estar juntos, en armonía: lo humano bendecido por lo cristiano, y lo cristiano acompañado gozosamente también por lo humano. Es el día en que la familia encuentra un

espacio para compartir y celebrar la fe en la parroquia, y encontrarse cara a cara con sus hermanos en la fe. No olvidemos el tiempo es de Dios. Démosle gracias por darnos oportunidad de vivir un día mas para manifestarle nuestro amor a Él y a su
