COMMUNITY CHAT
With Deacon Anthony Mammoliti

It never ceases to amaze me how other faith believers are so zealous in spreading the word about their beliefs. We have all seen from time to time members of Jehovah Witness, or perhaps members of the Mormon church on the street corners of our neighborhood ; perhaps even going door to door. At first glance we may be annoyed and just wish that they would just “go away”, but you have to respect their determination. They are “evangelizing”. Where does this determination come from? What is its origin? It comes from the call to evangelize the world. Its origin is in the very foundation of Christianity. In today’s Gospel we have Luke’s account of the first meeting of the eleven original disciples as well as others with the Risen Lord. The Gospel makes it quite clear that the resurrection of Jesus is not a story, and that the Risen Christ is not a ghost. It is all true. He is real, with a human body. Then Jesus says in the Gospel, all this has taken place so that repentance and forgiveness of sins might be preached in His name.

Christ’s sacrifice on the cross paid the debt occurred by mankind’s sins, past and present. People need to know about this. They need to benefit from this by believing in the Gospel and following Jesus Christ. The disciples were not content with staying in the Upper Room and just believing in Jesus themselves. They could not do that. The Lord demanded that they go out and tell others the Good News that the forgiveness of sins and eternal life were available for all people everywhere. The disciples had to become apostles. They had to become “evangelists”. The disciples could not keep the wonders of the New Life in Christ to themselves. We can’t either.

Evangelization is fundamental to Christianity. No one is called to be a Christian for himself or herself. We are called to bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to others. Every Sunday we come to Mass. We receive the great gift of God’s grace in the Word and in the Sacrament. And then we are commissioned at every Mass to take what we have received and to bring it out to the world. If we are not going to take Christ from here, then why did we come here?

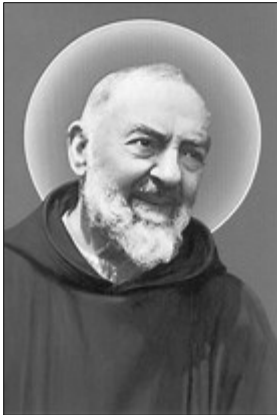

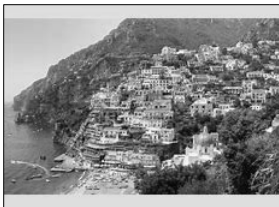

Gospel: Luke 24:35-48

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them, "Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have." And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "Have you anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sin, would be preached in his name, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things.

Poi, quando il lettore ha finito, colui che presiede rivolge parole di ammonimento e di esortazione che incitano a imitare gesta così belle. Quindi tutti insieme ci alziamo ed eleviamo preghiere e, finito di pregare, viene recato pane, vino e acqua. Allora colui che presiede formula la preghiera di lode e di ringraziamento con tutto il fervore e il popolo acclama: Amen! Infine a ciascuno dei presenti si distribuiscono e si partecipano gli elementi sui quali furono rese grazie, mentre i medesimi sono mandati agli assenti per mano dei diaconi.

(Lucas, 24,35-48)

"!JESUCRISTO HA RESUCITADO ALELUYA"!

Arrepentimiento y conversión de los pecados. Cristo resucitado anuncia a sus apóstoles que en su nombre (el nombre de Cristo) se predicará la conversión y el perdón de los pecados. Esto también estaba contenido en las Escrituras. Y así, vemos a Pedro mismo ante Israel predicar este arrepentimiento y este perdón. Y así escuchamos a Juan en su primera carta proclamar que, si alguno peca, sepa que tiene un abogado ante el Padre, Cristo el Señor.

Las fiestas pascuales son un momento de reflexión para hacer una conversión en la vida. El que ama a Dios no puede seguir pecando. El que conoce a Dios no puede seguir pecando. Quizá caerá por fragilidad, pero entre él y el pecado se ha dado una lucha que no conoce fin, pues el pecado lleva a la muerte, a la muerte segunda, a la pérdida definitiva de Dios.

«Dios, en su amorosa disposición al perdón -nos dice el santo Padre el 1 de enero de 1997-, ha llegado a darse a sí mismo al mundo en la Persona de su Hijo, el cual vino a traer la redención a cada individuo y a la humanidad entera. Ante las ofensas de los hombres, que culminan en su condena a la muerte de cruz, Jesús ruega: "Padre, perdónales, porque no saben lo que hacen _ (Lc 23, 34).

El perdón de Dios es expresión de su ternura como Padre. En la parábola evangélica del _ hijo pródigo" (cf. Lc 15, 11-32), el padre sale corriendo al encuentro de su hijo apenas lo ve que vuelve a casa. No le deja siquiera presentar sus disculpas: todo está perdonado (cf. Lc 15, 20-22). La inmensa alegría del perdón, ofrecido y acogido, sana heridas incurables, restablece nuevamente las relaciones y tiene sus raíces en el inagotable amor de Dios.

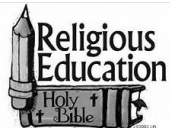
